OUR MATCHES

With nearly 60% of youth reporting anxiety and 16% reporting depression in 2023, that's a big deal. The impacts of mentoring are powerful, and we're working to bring them to more northern Nevada communities than ever as we head into 2024 and beyond thanks to partners like you.

THIS PAST YEAR

has brought us some important tools that will help us along that path. With a new home office located in the heart of Reno, we can offer expanded training opportunities for volunteers and families. We can host group activities for our Bigs and Littles and even neighborhood events to help us spread the word about the power of mentorship. And with new partnerships in place, we'll be able to enhance our program offerings, giving youth in our program better access to career exploration and more support as they plan for their futures. We're looking forward to sharing these plans and more with you with the launch of our new five-year strategic plan this spring. BBBSNN was determined not to let this obstacle interrupt programming to Bigs and Littles, and we decided to make a BIG investment in a permanent home for our program and staff. 600 Mill Street in downtown Reno now stands as the cornerstone of our organization and has turned an uncertain time for our agency into an exciting opportunity to spread our roots in the northern Nevada community.

The acquisition of this dedicated building has opened up exciting possibilities.

The increased square footage has allowed us to expand our programming and training areas, fostering a more vibrant and supportive environment for our Littles, Bigs, and families. Group in-person mentor orientations, group trainings for parents on vital youth development and safety subjects, and dynamic in-office group match activities for program participants are now enhanced and more accessible to our matches. Craft nights, holiday events, and the upcoming communal garden in our outdoor space are all helping us become more immersed in the community we love and serve, one event at a time.

Our new home, centrally located in Reno, positions us conveniently close to our Lunch Buddies school partners and our nonprofit partners, and offers easy public transportation access for our families and volunteers. It's helping us collaborate with our community more than ever, and has provided a stability that strengthens our enduring commitment to community and youth empowerment in northern Nevada.

Looking forward, we're enthusiastic about the potential for future growth. Fundraising campaigns, donor tours, and other initiatives will further enhance our capacity to make a positive impact on northern Nevada. As we embark on this exciting journey, the spirit of resilience and determination propels us forward, shaping a future filled with opportunities for our community and beyond. 

Applications for the Gretchen Hass Scholarship undergo a rigorous evaluation process led by our team. Board Members, Big Brothers Big Sisters staff, and community members collaboratively review each application, ensuring a thorough assessment of the applicant's qualifications. Littles are evaluated based on their community service/impact, academic performance, future plans/goals, extracurricular activities, essays, and references. Upon approval, the scholarship funds, will be disbursed as direct payments to the student's chosen educational institution. This ensures that the financial assistance goes precisely where it's needed the most—covering tuition, books, and other essential educational expenses. This program underscores our unwavering commitment to fostering the potential within each Little. By providing comprehensive support and a substantial scholarship amount, The Gretchen Hass Scholarship Fund empowers Littles to overcome financial barriers and pursue their academic dreams with confidence. We eagerly anticipate the positive impact it will have on the lives of our Littles, and know it will promote a brighter and more promising future for each individual we serve.

Big Sister Sonia + Little Sister Sofia

I have always believed in the power of mentorship and [as a former Little] I felt like I could offer a unique perspective as part of something that I loved so much as a kid.

Big Sister Sonia is not only a volunteer mentor, but also a Bilingual Family Enrollment Specialist here at Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northern Nevada. When Sonia joined the team, we were all incredibly touched by her reason for wanting to work at BBBSNN. She herself was a Little Sister who benefited from this program as a child. "I loved having a Big Sister," says Sonia. "Laura played games with me, she helped me figure out things about myself, and she made me feel important. Having a Big made me feel seen. She opened my eyes to the possibility of college and became the only person I had consistent conversations with about myself." When Sonia saw a job opening at BBBSNN, she couldn't help but feel like a full-circle moment was meant to be. "I have always believed in the power of mentorship and as someone who was involved in the program before, I felt like I could offer a unique perspective as part of something that I loved so much as a kid," says Sonia. Just a few months after starting this position, Sonia started the process of becoming a Big Sister. The stars truly aligned when our team found the perfect match for her at the same school where Sonia herself was a Little. Little Sister Sofia, 8 years-old, lives in a multigenerational home with other family members and their kids, so she was excited by the opportunity to join Big Brothers Big Sisters and have some true one-on-one time with her mentor. Sofia's family was concerned she may be experiencing some bullying at school, and felt that a Big Sister could help her be more confident, focused, and independent. Sofia loves kittens, and hopes to become a veterinarian someday.

Though Sofia is rather shy, she was eager to start her match. "Meeting Sofia, I felt a strong sense of connection to her right away," says Sonia.



The moment itself was a little surreal because of how full-circle it felt." At their first meeting, Sofia asked Sonia if she knew about Hello Kitty and quizzed her Big Sister on all of her favorite characters. At the end of this first meeting, Sofia gifted her Big Sister a few small Hello Kitty stickers she had in her pocket. Sonia knew right away what a good activity for them would be, and the next time they met Sonia brought lots of stickers for them to decorate journals with together.

Our Match Support Specialist working with Sofia and Sonia, Mariela, thinks the two are a great match because of their complementary personalities. "Sonia, with her cheerful and outgoing personality, can help Sofia come out of her shell by aiding her in becoming more sure of herself and confident," Mariela says. "Sonia also has experience as a teacher and therefore will have a good grasp on tackling academic goals that Sofia's parent and teacher both identified." Sonia believes her own Big Sister, Laura, played a part in inspiring her to reach the successful career she has today. "I decided I should care about school because college sounded fun when she would talk about it," Sonia says. "Having someone that cared about me and took time to ask me about myself gave me a stronger sense of self and higher self-esteem."




Jim joined Big Brothers Big Sisters as a mentor after hearing multiple people he knew speak highly of the program. He already understood the importance of mentorship because of a mentor he had in his life growing up. "My grandmother was my mentor," says Jim. "She watched over me as my parents each worked long hours. She gave me the gift of appreciating how important it is to be fair, to be kind, and to give back to the community. She was also my Big in a way because I was an only child and most of my time spent after school was with her." Some of the goals that Nathan and Jim have set for their match include helping Nathan develop his interests (like soccer), showing him how to improve interpersonal relationships, and bettering his self-image. Jim knows that the way to help Nathan accomplish these goals isn't through any over-the-top activities; instead Nathan grows the most when they focus on quality time and learning from one another. "It's not what we do, it's how we spend our time together," says Jim. "It can be a talk about what may have happened at school. Or it's a full field soccer match with he and I passing the ball to each other. Or us playing fraction dominoes. It doesn't matter what we do; it is how we make one another stronger and better people." For as much as Jim teaches Nathan, he feels his Little Brother has had just as strong of an impact on him. "Nathan teaches me to be understanding and to listen," Jim says. "We don't listen enough. Oh, and he also schools me at soccer."






FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

In joining Big Brothers Big Sisters, Lilly and her family were hoping she would make a new friend who could help her build her self-esteem, express her feelings, and improve her academic performance. Growing up, Lilly has faced a few challenges like being exposed to substance abuse, and she and her family were very excited for her to meet her Big Sister.

Big Sister Joy joined Big Brothers Big Sisters because of her love for kids. "I saw being a Big as a great opportunity to give back to my community in a meaningful way by working one-on-one with the next generation," she says. Joy is no stranger to serving youth in Northern Nevada, as she is the Executive Director of Girls on the Run Sierras. Joy supports Lilly's academic success and has been a very positive role model for girl empowerment to Lilly. Since being matched, Lilly has continued to thrive in school and improved her decision-making skills. She is sociable and makes positive friendships with her peers. Joy is a very important person in Lilly's life and she proudly talks about her Big Sister to anyone she knows. "Lilly cares a lot about Joy," says Lilly's grandmother, Zoña. "Every Wednesday Lilly knows Joy is coming and that has become her favorite day at school."

Joy says that her Little Sister has taught her the importance of greeting people by name. Lilly will greet everyone she sees with "hello" and their first name, which makes people smile and feel seen. "My hope for Lilly in the future is that she becomes the rad, caring, strong, funny, and smart woman that I see in her," Joy says.

Lilly and Joy are members of our Lunch Buddies site-based mentoring program, where Joy visits Lilly's school for about an hour once a week, over lunch. They have also attended some of our agency events like our 2023 Holiday Party, where they played at The Discovery and ate cotton candy together. To anyone considering becoming a Big, Joy says "DO IT! I should have joined this program years ago. Every second I spend with Lilly is worth it!"


